

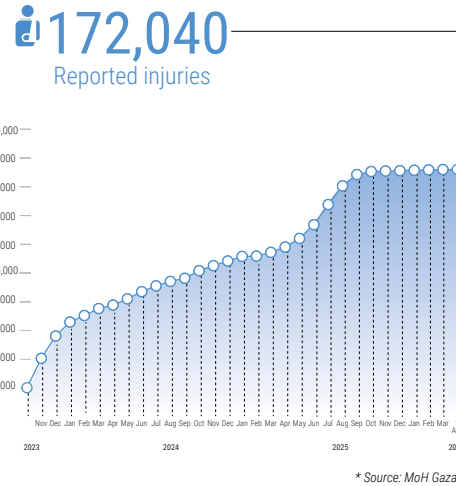
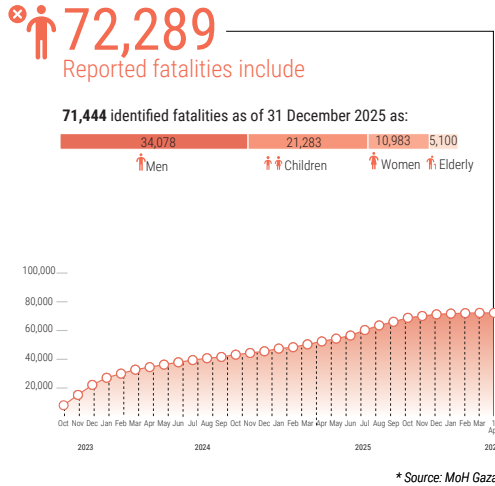

REPORTED CASUALTIES (Cumulative) as of 1 April 2026

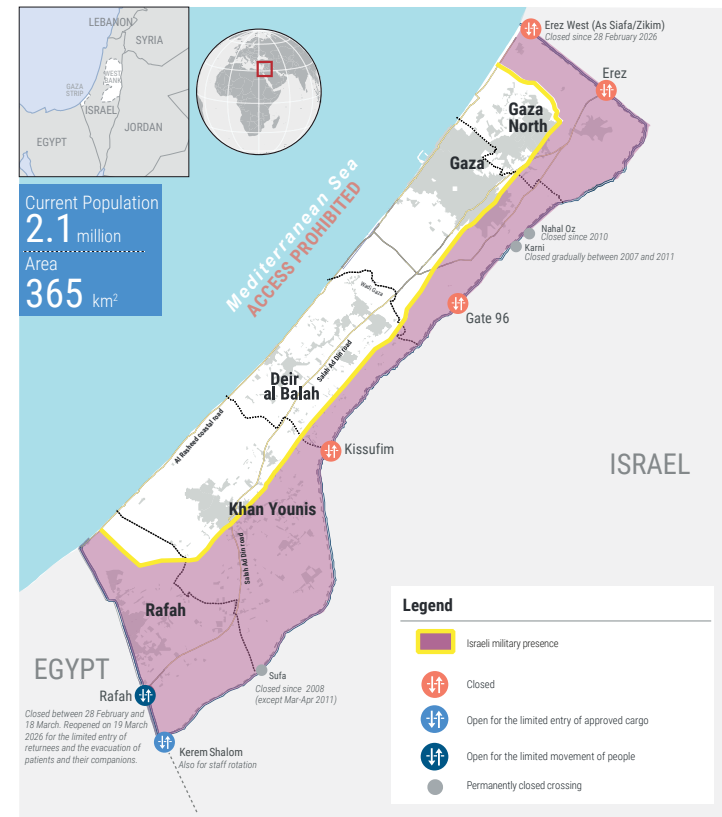

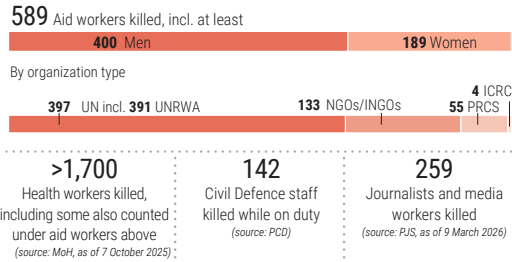

PROTECTION



- 2.1 million** people are estimated to be in need of protection and MHPSS, including **1.1 million** children (Flash Appeal, December 2025 and UNICEF, December 2025).
- >58,000** children have lost one or both parents (source: UNICEF, December 2025).

REPORTED DAMAGE

- 81%** of all structures are destroyed or damaged (source: UNOSAT, as of 11 October 2025).
- 89%** of WASH sector assets have been either destroyed or damaged (source: IRDNA, issued in February 2025).
- 88%** of the 48,987 assessed establishments in the commerce and industry sector in Gaza have been damaged or destroyed, including 22% damaged and 66% destroyed (source: IRDNA, issued in February 2025).
- 77%** of the total road network has been damaged (including destroyed, affected roads and roads restricted by obstacles), across the Gaza Strip (source: UNOSAT, as of 8 July 2025).
- 145** historical and cultural sites damaged (source: UNESCO, as of 4 November 2025).

FOOD SECURITY

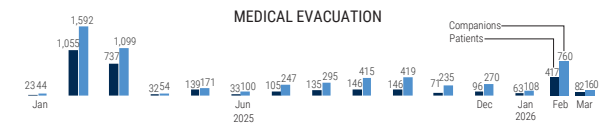
- 77%** (1.6 million people) of the analyzed 2.076 million people in North Gaza, Gaza, Deir al Balah and Khan Younis governorates are currently facing and projected to face crisis or worse levels of acute food insecurity (IPC Phase 3 or above) between 1 December 2025 and 15 April 2026, including **1,900** in Catastrophe (IPC Phase 5), **571,000** in Emergency (IPC Phase 4), and **1.028** million in Crisis (IPC Phase 3).*
 - 48%** of surveyed households relied on waste burning to prepare food.**
 - 86.7%** of agricultural water wells damaged (source: FAO, as of 26 September 2025).
 - 79.5%** of greenhouses damaged (source: UNOSAT and FAO, as of 5 October 2025).
 - 87%** of cropland damaged, including: **89%** of orchard and other trees (incl. **90%** of olive trees), **88.1%** of field crops, and **80.2%** of vegetables (source: UNOSAT and FAO, as of 28 September 2025).
 - 4%** of Gaza's cropland is undamaged and accessible (source: UNOSAT and FAO, as of 15 October 2025).

NUTRITION

- >3,700** children aged 6-59 months were admitted for malnutrition treatment in February, compared with **>4,600** in January 2026. This includes over **600** with Severe Acute Malnutrition in February compared with over **890** in January (source: Nutrition Cluster).*
 - 64%** of children consumed ≤ 2 food groups while **<10%** of children achieved minimum dietary diversity (≥ 5 food groups) in January 2026. (source: Nutrition Cluster - January CATI survey)
 - >60%** of children aged 6-23 months experienced severe food poverty, consuming fewer than two food groups out of the recommended eight food groups per day, in December (source: Nutrition Cluster, December 2025).
 - 37,000** pregnant and breastfeeding women are projected to suffer from acute malnutrition and require treatment in 2026.**
 - 25,000** infants under six months, about **101,000** children aged 6-59 months, and **120,000** children aged 5-17 years are projected to suffer from acute malnutrition and will require treatment in 2026. These include **31,000** children aged 6-59 months projected to suffer from severe acute malnutrition**

HEALTH*

- 35** Emergency Medical Teams (EMTs) including 310 national and 82 international personnel, as of 1 April 2026.
- >18,500** critical patients, including **4,000** children, require medical evacuation. Between 25 and 31 March, **53** patients and **94** companions were evacuated via Rafah crossing.



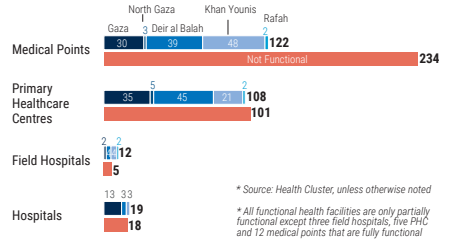
EDUCATION*

- 637,475** school-aged children without sustained access to formal, in-person education.
 - 64,000** children at the age of five without access to early childhood education.
 - ~93%** of school buildings (526 out of 564) will require full reconstruction or major rehabilitation to be functional again (as of 11 October 2025).
 - >63** university buildings destroyed (source: MoE, as of 12 August 2025).

SHELTER

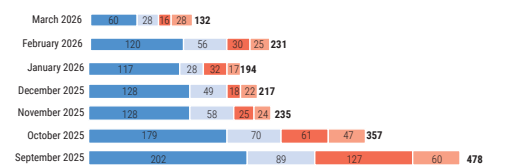
- ~900,000** people are in need of emergency shelter items (source: Shelter Cluster, February 2026)
- 320,622** housing units in Gaza have been damaged (source: UNOSAT, as of 11 October 2025).

HUMANITARIAN ACCESS

Missions requiring coordination with the Israeli authorities



- Facilitated:** CLA accepts a facilitation request and the movement on the ground is not impeded.
- Impeded:** CLA accepts a facilitation request but the movement is blocked or delayed on the ground, resulting in some missions being aborted or accomplished partially.
- Denied:** The Israeli Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) rejects a facilitation request.
- Withdrawn:** Humanitarian organizations cancel their facilitation request due to logistical, operational, or security reasons.
