





- Over 96% of children aged 6-23 months and women are not meeting their nutrient requirements due to lack of minimum diet diversity.
- 290,000 children under five and 150,000 pregnant and breastfeeding women require feeding and micronutrient supplements.

н WATER AND SANITATION*

- 87,358 m³ of water produced and supplied on average per day between 24 and 30 November, less than a quarter of water supply prior to October 2023. This includes a daily average of 35,000 m² of water produced by municipal water wells.
 1 million people are at risk of sanitation-related threats, including rodents and pests (76%), solid waste (54%), sewage (64%), and human waste (34%).
 62% (1.4 million) of people receive less than the recommended 6 litres per person per day for drinking and cooking.
 47% of people receive less than the minimum recommended 15 litres per person per day for drinking, cooking, and basic hygiene.







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


