



WATER AND SANITATION*

• 49% of people in Gaza accessed less than the minimum emergency standard of 6 litres of drinking water per day, for drinking and cooking, as of 5 September 2025.

- . 28% accessed less than the minimum emergency standard of 9 litres of domestic water per day, for hygiene and cleaning, as of 5 September 2025.
- . 64% of households experienced infestations of lice and mites, while 57% were affected by skin conditions such as rashes and scabies due to poor hygiene and overcrowding, as of 5 September 2025.
- . 89% of the WASH sector assets have been either destroyed or damaged (source: IRDNA, issued in February 2025).

SHELTER*

- ~1.48 million people are in need of emergency shelter items, while around 1.47 million people are estimated to require essential household items.
- 320.622 housing units in Gaza have been damaged (Source: UNOSAT, as of 11. October 2025) *Source: Shelter Cluster assessment. October 2025, unless otherwise noted

** FOOD SECURITY*

- 2 meals a day on average were consumed by households, 1-15 October 2025.
- · 38% of households in Gaza and North Gaza governorates relied on humanitarian aid as their primary source of food, 1-15 October 2025.
- 54% of households in Deir al Balah and Khan Younis governorates relied on humanitarian aid as their primary source of food, 1-15 October 2025.
- 20% of households went a full day without eating at least once in the last 30 days, 1-15 October 2025.
- · Consumption of protein sources, fruits and vegetables is extremely limited, 1-15 October 2025
- >60% of households relied on waste burning to prepare food, 1-15 October 2025
- 86.7% of agricultural water wells damaged (source: FAO, as of 26 September 2025).
- 79.5% of greenhouses damaged (source: UNOSAT and FAO, as of 5 October 2025). · 87% of cropland damaged, including: 89% of orchard and other trees (incl. 90% of
- olive trees), 88.1% of field crops, and 80.2% of vegetables (source: UNOSAT and FAO, as of 28 September).
- 4% of Gaza's cropland is undamaged and accessible (source: UNOSAT and FAO. as of 15 October).

NUTRITION*

- · An estimated 132,000 cases of children aged 6 to 59 months and 55,500 pregnant and breastfeeding women are projected to suffer from acute malnutrition through June 2026, including 41,000 severe cases of children.**
- 25.000 infants are at risk of acute malnutrition and require urgent nutrition support between 1 July 2025 and 30 June 2026.**
- >90% of children under two years consume fewer than two food groups per day, with high-protein foods and micronutrient-rich items extremely scarce (as of September 2025)
- 290,000** children between six months and five years and 150,000 pregnant and breastfeeding women require feeding and micronutrient supplements (monthly caseload, January-December 2025).

SHEALTH*

- . 35 Emergency Medical Teams (EMTs), as of 2 November.
- . One million people in Gaza require mental health interventions (source: WHO, as of October 2025).
- · Over 16,500 critical patients require medical evacuation abroad. Since 1 January 2025, 2,551 patients and 4,436 companions have been evacuated outside Gaza, including 50 patients and 116 companions between 29 October and 4 November.


EDUCATION*


- · >18,639 school students and 792 educational staff killed and >27,319 students and 3,251 teachers injured (source: MoE, as of 4 November 2025).
- 637,475 school-aged children without sustained access to formal, in-person education
- 64,000 children at the age of five without access to early childhood education.
- · Nearly 91.8% of schools (518 out of 564) will require full reconstruction or major rehabilitation to be functional again (as of 8 July 2025).
- >63 university buildings destroyed (source: MoE, as of 12 August 2025).

REPORTED DAMAGE

- 81% of all structures are destroyed or damaged (Source: UNOSAT, as of 11 October 2025)
- 88% of the 48,987 assessed establishments in the commerce and industry sector in Gaza have been damaged or destroyed, including 22% damaged and 66% destroyed (source: IRDNA, issued in February 2025).
- 77% of the total road network has been damaged (including destroyed, affected roads and roads restricted by obstacles), across the Gaza Strip (source: UNOSAT, as of 8 July 2025).

Facilitated: CLA accepts a facilitation request and the movement on the ground is not

Withdrawn: Humanitarian organizations cancel their facilitation request due to logistical, operational, or security reasons.
