





FOOD SECURITY

- · 77% (1.6 million people) of the analyzed 2.076 million people in North Gaza, Gaza, Deir al Balah and Khan Younis governorates are currently facing and projected to face crisis or worse levels of acute food insecurity (IPC Phase 3 or above) between 1 December 2025 and 15 April 2026, including: 1,900 in Catastrophé (IPC Phase 5), 571,000 in Emergency (IPC Phase 4), and 1.028 million in Crisis (IPC Phase 3).3
- · 43% of surveyed households relied on waste burning to prepare food, 1-15 December 2025 (source: WFP Market Monitor).
- · 86.7% of agricultural water wells damaged (source: FAO, as of 26 September 2025)
- 79.5% of greenhouses damaged (source: UNOSAT and FAO, as of 5 October 2025).
- · 87% of cropland damaged, including: 89% of orchard and other trees (incl. 90% of olive trees), 88.1% of field crops, and 80.2% of vegetables (source: UNOSAT and FAO, as of 28 September 2025).
- 4% of Gaza's cropland is undamaged and accessible (source: UNOSAT and FAO. as of 15 October 2025)

- >90,000 children aged 6-59 months were admitted for malnutrition treatment so far in 2025, compared with >40,000 admissions in 2024 (source: Nutrition Cluster).
- No children aged 6-23 months met the minimum dietary diversity standard (> 5 food groups), while over 63% experienced severe food poverty, consuming fewer than two out of the recommended eight food groups/day, between 16 October and 30 November 2025 (source: IPC Gaza Strip Special Snapshot)
- · 37,000 pregnant and breastfeeding women are projected to suffer from acute malnutrition and require treatment in 2026.*
- 25,000 infants under six months, about 101,000 children aged 6-9 months, and 120,000 children aged 5-17 years are projected to suffer from acute malnutrition and will require treatment in 2026. These include 31,000 children aged 6-59 months prioiected to suffer from severe acute malnutrition:

SHEALTH*

- 35 Emergency Medical Teams (EMTs) including 73 international and 270 national personnel, as of 17 December.
- Over 18.500 critical patients, including 4.000 children, require medical evacuation abroad. Since 1 January 2025, 2,665 patients and 4,817 companions have been evacuated outside Gaza, including most recently 25 patients and 92 companions on 08 December


EDUCATION*

- >18,863 school students and 792 educational staff killed and >27,391 students and 3,251 teachers injured (source: MoE, as of 9 December 2025).
- · 637,475 school-aged children without sustained access to formal, in-person education
- 64,000 children at the age of five without access to early childhood education.
- · ~93% of school buildings (526 out of 564) will require full reconstruction or major rehabilitation to be functional again (as of 11 October 2025).
- >63 university buildings destroyed (source: MoE, as of 12 August 2025).

SHELTER

- · ~1.28 million people are in need of emergency shelter items (source: Shelter Cluster, December 2025).
- · 320,622 housing units in Gaza have been damaged (source: UNOSAT, as of 11 October 2025).



Facilitated: CLA accepts a facilitation request and the movement on the ground is not impeded

Impeded: CLA accepts a facilitation request but the movement is blocked or delayed on the ground, resulting in some missions being aborted or accomplished partially.

Denied: The Israeli Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) rejects a facilitation

Withdrawn: Humanitarian organizations cancel their facilitation request due to logistical, operational, or security reasons.
