





FOOD SECURITY*

- 1.5 meals a day on average were consumed by households in September 2025.
- ~50% of households relied on humanitarian aid as their primary food source in September 2025.
- . 29% of households went a full day without eating in September 2025.
- · Severe shortages of animal protein, vegetables, and fruits reported in September 2025.
- Two-thirds of households burned waste to prepare food in September 2025.
- 83% of agricultural water wells and 71% of greenhouses damaged (source: FAO, as of April 2025).
- . 86% of the total cropland is damaged (source: UNOSAT and FAO, as of 28 July).

NUTRITION*

- An estimated 132,000 cases of children aged 6 to 59 months and 55,500 pregnant and breastfeeding women are projected to suffer from acute malnutrition through June 2026, including 41,000 severe cases of children.***
- 25,000 infants are at risk of acute malnutrition and require urgent nutrition support between 1 July 2025 and 30 June 2026.**
- >90% of children under two years consume fewer than two food groups per day, with high-protein foods and micronutrient-rich items extremely scarce (as of September 2025).
- 290,000** children between six months and five years and 150,000 pregnant and breastfeeding women require feeding and micronutrient supplements (monthly caseload, January-December 2025).

\$HEALTH*

- 32 Emergency Medical Teams (EMTs) deployed, as of 19 October.
- One million people in Gaza require mental health interventions (source: WHO, as
 of October 2025).
- Over 15,600 critical patients, including 3,800 children, require medical evacuation abroad. Since 1 January 2025, 2,501 patients and 4,320 companions have been evacuated outside Gaza, including 96 patients and 303 companions between 22 and 28 October.



EDUCATION*

- >18,591 school students and 791 educational staff killed and >27,216 students and 3,251 teachers injured (source: MoE, as of 28 October 2025).
- 637,475 school-aged children without sustained access to formal, in-person education.
- 64,000 children at the age of five without access to early childhood education.
- Nearly 91.8% of schools (518 out of 564) will require full reconstruction or major rehabilitation to be functional again (as of 8 July 2025).
- >63 university buildings destroyed (source: MoE, as of 12 August 2025).

REPORTED DAMAGE

- 78% of all structures are destroyed or damaged (source: UNOSAT, as of 8 July 2025).
- 88% of the 48,987 assessed establishments in the commerce and industry sector in Gaza have been damaged or destroyed, including 22% damaged and 66% destroyed (source: IRDNA, issued in February 2025).
- 77% of the total road network has been damaged (including destroyed, affected roads and roads restricted by obstacles), across the Gaza Strip (source: UNOSAT, as of 8 July 2025).



- Facilitated: CLA accepts a facilitation request and the movement on the ground is not impeded.
- Impeded: CLA accepts a facilitation request but the movement is blocked or delayed on the ground, resulting in some missions being aborted or accomplished partially.
- Denied: The Israeli Coordination and Liaison Administration (CLA) rejects a facilitation request
- Withdrawn: Humanitarian organizations cancel their facilitation request due to logistical, operational, or security reasons.

SHELTER*
