

MOVEMENT AND ACCESS

- •All Israeli crossings are closed since 7 October; Kerem Shalom is used to inspect humanitarian goods.
- Rafah crossing with Egypt is used to bring in approved humanitarian goods, and for the movement of some wounded and sick
- people, and aid workers. Access to the sea and to areas near Israel's perimeter fence are restricted.
