### **OVERVIEW**

The snapshot provides a comprehensive overview of the ongoing humanitarian crisis in Gaza as of 15 December 2023, including casualties, particularly among women and children.

Significant damage has been inflicted upon critical infrastructure and essential services, affecting people's ability to maintain their dignity and basic living standards.

This snapshot highlights reported figures on the impact of hostilities on people in Gaza, where a major humanitarian crisis has unfolded.



## MOVEMENT AND ACCESS

- All Israeli crossings are closed since 7 October; on 15 December, the Israeli authorities said they would open Kerem Shalom
- Rafah crossing with Egypt is used to bring in approved humanitarian goods, and for the movement of some wounded and sick people, and aid workers.
- ·Access to the sea and to areas near Israel's perimeter fence are restricted.
