

🕏 HEALTH

- 11 hospitals partially functioning (5 in north & 6 south of Wadi Gaza). 26 hospitals are out of service.
- 6 field hospitals functional (4 in Rafah & 2 in Khan Younis).
- ~30% of primary health care facilities functional.
- >643,000 cases of acute respiratory infections (source: WHO).
- >346,000 cases of diarrhea, of which 31% (~106,000) are children under 5 (source: WHO).
- 23 Emergency Medical Teams (EMTs).
- 33% (8 out of 24) of UNRWA health centers are operational

NUTRITION

- 28 children died of malnutrition & dehydration (source: MoH Gaza). ~31% of children under the age of two in northern Gaza suffer from .
- **16% of children under the age of two in Rafah suffer from acute.

 **30% of groundwater wells are not operating.

EDUCATION

- 625,000 students with no access to education.

SHELTER

- square metre of average space per person in IDP shelters.

- . 150-155 UNRWA installations shelter IDPs

** FOOD SECURITY

- **854K** people facing emergency levels of food insecurity (*IPC* ->1 million children in need of mental health and psycho-social support.
- 1.1 million people facing catastrophic levels of food . ~17,000 children are unaccompanied or separated insecurity (IPC Phase 5).*
- 60-70% of meat and dairy-producing livestock killed or prematurely slaughtered (source: FAO).

WATER AND SANITATION

One out of three water pipelines coming from Israel is

functional.

- All wastewater treatment systems are non-operational; one of them is partially working.
- No access to clean water in the northern governorates • Two out of three main water desalination plants are partially
- · ~57% of assessed WASH facilities damaged/destroyed.

PROTECTION

- **265K** people facing crisis levels of food insecurity (*IPC Phase 3*).*: ~1.7 million internally displaced persons (IDPs).

 - At least 249 aid workers killed (243 nationals, 6 foreigners), including:
 - 181 UN staff UNRWA: 178; WHO: 1; UNDP: 1; UNOPS: 1
 - 27 PRCS staff and volunteers, including 17 while on duty.
 - · At least 41 other aid workers.
 - **490** health workers killed, including at least 15 also counted under aid workers above (source: MoH Gaza).
 - 66 Civil Defence staff killed while on duty (source: GMO).
 - 140 journalists and media workers killed (source: GMO)


REPORTED DAMAGE

- >60% of residential buildings (World Bank, as of Jan 2024).
- >80% of commercial facilities (World Bank, as of Jan 2024)
- At least 3 churches and 237 mosques destroyed (source: GMO).
- · 155 health facilities (source: MoH Gaza) 163 UNRWA installations (source: UNRWA)
- 126 ambulances (source: MoH Gaza).

MOVEMENT AND ACCESS

Between 1-19 April, 32 humanitaria aid missions to northern Gaza were facilitated by the Israeli authorities (including 21 related to food assistance), 14 were denied or impeded, and 8 were cancelled due to logistical constraints. Moreover, 104 aid missions to areas in southern Gaza that require coordination were facilitated by the Israeli authorities, 13 were denied or impeded, and 10 were cancelled.

•50% (5,004 out of 9,762) of patients who submitted requests for medical evacuation have been approved, of whom 83% (4,083) have been medically evacuated abroad (source: WHO).
