Protection of Civilians - Weekly Briefing Notes

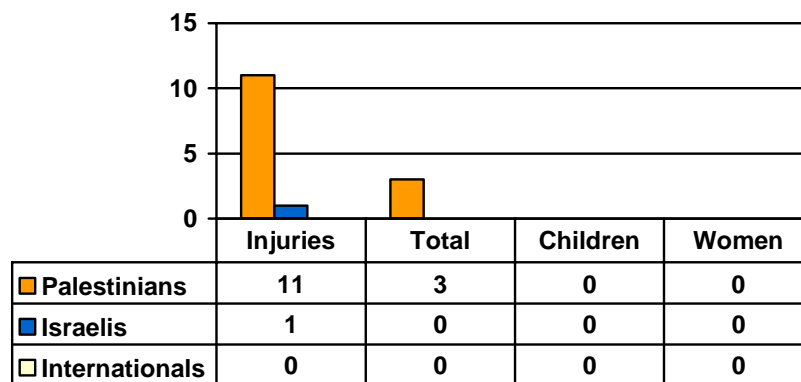
16 – 22 November 2005

Of note this week

- Over 20 Palestinian structures were demolished by the IDF in Jerusalem and the Jordan Valley this week.
- External closure was lifted throughout the West Bank (previously access for Palestinian workers and traders to Israel was only resumed for residents of the southern West Bank from 14 November).

1. Physical Protection

Casualties



- **17 November:** The IDF assaulted and injured a 55-year-old Palestinian from Jamma'in (Nablus) while working his farm land.
- **17 November:** Israeli settlers from Itamar injured a 85-year-old Palestinian from 'Awarta village (Nablus) who was picking olives in his field.
- **17 November:** One Palestinian was injured near Huwwara (Nablus) after being run over by vehicle driven by an Israeli setter on Road No. 60.
- **17 November:** During an operation by an Israeli under cover unit two Palestinians (19 and 21 years old) were killed on Haifa road near Al Yamun village (Jenin) after the Unit opened fire at their vehicle.
- **18 November:** Palestinians threw a Molotov cocktail at an IDF jeep patrolling in Nablus city injuring one IDF soldier.
- **18 November:** The IDF responded to Palestinian stone throwing in Sabastiya village (Nablus) with tear gas canisters and rubber-coated metal bullets. One Palestinian was injured.
- **18 November:** The IDF shot a 14- year old Palestinian from Silwad (Ramallah) near Road No. 60. The child was hospitalized in Israel and is reported to have been semi-paralysed.
- **18 November:** A 24-year-old Palestinian man from Hebron city was killed by the IDF near the Palestinian village of Beit Kahil (Hebron). According to the IDF, the Palestinian was involved in an explosion that took place near Road No. 35.
- **19 November:** The IDF shot a 16-year-old Palestinian from Silwad (Ramallah) in the leg. The youth was later detained by the IDF.
- **19 November:** Four Palestinians were injured during a demonstration organised by Palestinians, international and Israeli activists against the construction of the Barrier construction in Bil'in (Ramallah). Three Israeli activists were detained.
- **19 November:** One Palestinian was injured during a demonstration organised by Palestinians, international and Israeli activists against the implementation of the "special security arrangements" around Ofarim and Beit Arye settlements (Ramallah).

- **15 – 22 November:** 14 houses were demolished at various locations in Jerusalem governorate for reportedly being built without permits. A further eight structures were demolished in the Jordan Valley.

Other shelter/property related incidents:

- **16 November:** An appeal submitted to the IDF by Palestinians to stop demolition of four animal barracks in the Palestinian village of Tuqu (Bethlehem) was denied. The demolition orders were issued to local residents for building the structures in Area C. Two of the structures have been demolished by the Palestinian owners.

3. Natural Resources:

Land levelling/Requisitions/Tree Uprooting¹

Nablus Governorate:

Ongoing incidents:

- The IDF continues levelling land along side Road No. 505 near Jamma'in village to install a security fence.

Jenin Governorate:

20 November: The IDF issued a military order (T/184/05) requisitioning land for 9.5 dunums (10 hectares) in Ya'bad (Jenin) to build an observation tower.

Tubas Governorate:

No incidents to report.

Tulkarm Governorate:

Ongoing incidents:

- Land levelling around Avnei Khfets and Enav settlements continues for the construction of a new fence around the settlements.

Qalqiliya Governorate:

16 November: Israeli contractors began levelling land from Jayyus village (Qalqiliya) in the closed areas to expand Zfim settlement.

Ongoing incidents:

- The IDF continues levelling land near Immatin village and between 'Azzun and Kafr Thulth for the construction of the Barrier.

Salfit Governorate:

Ongoing incidents:

- Israeli contractors continues levelling land north of Salfit city, Iskaka and Deir Istiya villages and south of Marda and Kifl Haris villages around Ari'el settlement and near Az Zawiya and Deir Ballut villages for the construction of the Barrier.
- The IDF continues levelling land alongside Road No. 505 near Marda and Haris villages to install a security fence.

Ramallah / Al Bireh Governorate:

19 November: The IDF issued a military order for a Palestinian farmer from Shuqba to stop work on his land and to return the land to its original state.

11 November: The IDF uprooted at least 35 olive trees belonging to Beit Liqya village in order to build a new road between Beit Liqya (Ramallah) and Beit Anan (Jerusalem).

Ongoing incidents:

- The construction of the Barrier between Budrus to south of Al Midya is in the final stage. The construction of the Barrier between Kharbatha Bani Harith, Bil'in and Saffa villages (all west Ramallah) continues. Construction of the Barrier is also ongoing between Beituniya and Beit 'Ur al Fauqa, between At Tira and Beit Duqqu, south of Beit Liqya, and north and south of Rantis checkpoint.

Hebron Governorate:

Ongoing incidents:

- Land leveling for construction of the Barrier is ongoing along the southern section of the Green Line. The contractors are paving the security road running along the Barrier to the south of Shani settlement. In the western section the Barrier has reached Ar Ramadin, as well as along the western side of Idhna. Israeli contractors are also levelling land for a new terminal along the last section of Road No. 60 before crossing into Israel.

Bethlehem Governorate:

17 November: The IDF issued two amendments to military orders:

- T/136/05 requisitioning Palestinian land south-east of Efrata settlement for the construction of the Barrier. The new military order revises the route of the Barrier near the Palestinian village of Wadi Rahhal and reduces the amount of land requisitioned from 155 to 115 dunums (15.5 to 11.5 hectares).
- T/32/04 requisitioning Palestinian land north-west of Beit Jala town for the construction of the Barrier. The new military order revises the route of the Barrier near the Cremisan monastery and reduces the amount of land requisitioned from 175 to 119 dunums (17.5 to 11.9 hectares).

17 November: The IDF issued a military order (T/201/05) requisitioning 94 dunums (9.4 hectares) of agricultural land belonging to Palestinian farmers from the town of Al Khadr. The requisitioned land will be used to construct the Barrier on the section of Road No. 60 (from Al Khadr junction to the southern entrance of Bethlehem city).

Ongoing incidents:

- Contractors for the construction of the Barrier fenced in the area around Khamat an Nu'man. The main road from Al Khas is open with high presence of the IDF in the area. The local community is facing problems in accessing the main internal road on wet days as the quality of the road has deteriorated during the construction of the Barrier.
- Land levelling and new housing construction is ongoing in the settlements of Efrat and its two northern outposts (Givat Hatamar and Givat Hadagan), as well as northeast of Neve Daniel, and in Har Gilo and Betar Illit.
- Construction of the Barrier is ongoing in the last section around Rachel's Tomb north of the building hosting the Al Waqf.

Jerusalem Governorate:

Ongoing incidents:

- The construction of the Barrier is ongoing all along the projected route in the Jerusalem governorate; exceptions to this are northeast of Al 'Eizariyya towards Ma'ale Adumim settlement and the Bir Nabala planned enclave.
- The IDF closed the road from Qalandiya checkpoint towards Atarot Checkpoint; construction is taking place in the area to continue the part of the Barrier near Qalandiya and Al Ram area for the new arrangements at the Qalandiya checkpoint.

Jericho Governorate:

No incidents to report.

The Gaza Strip:

Ongoing incidents:

- Construction continues of a concrete wall north of Beit Hanoun and Beit Lahia. The borders are also being enforced with the placement of new military bases and observation towers.

- The IDF informed the Palestinian DCO that the eastern part of Beit Hanoun (about one km along the security fence east of Beit Hanoun) had been declared a closed military zone.
- The IDF announced that Palestinians should keep a distance of at least 150 metres away from the perimeter fence in the eastern and northern Gaza Strip.

4. Access for Medical Assistance:

- **13 November** (previously not reported): A PRCS ambulance was denied access to transport a wounded Palestinian from Nablus to Jenin. When the ambulance arrived at the scene IDF soldiers fired warning shots and ordered the PRCS team to leave. The team returned to the scene two hours later and were again denied access by the IDF. The injured Palestinian later died and the PRCS ambulance was called to transport the body.

5. Access and Movement for Civilians:

a) Curfew

Curfew Incidents:

- **16 November:** The IDF imposed curfew on Madama village (Nablus) after Palestinians stoned Israeli vehicles travelling on Road No. 60.
- **16 November:** The IDF imposed curfew on Al 'Auja (Jericho) for one day.
- **18 November:** The IDF imposed curfew on Al Funduq village (Qalqiliya) after Palestinians stoned Israeli vehicles travelling on Road No. 55.
- **21 November:** At approximately midnight, the IDF imposed a curfew on Beit Liqya. Throughout the night and early hours of the morning, construction equipment was brought in to start levelling land for a new road between the village and Beit Anan in Jerusalem governorate.

b) Access to Education

West Bank:

Jericho:

16 November: School students from Al 'Auja could not attend their schools on this day due to the imposition of curfew by the IDF.

Hebron:

- Ongoing incidents:
 - Teachers coming from the Palestinian towns of Yatta and Samu' are still facing problems in reaching Imneizil elementary school as IDF soldiers deny them access at Beit Yatir checkpoint.
 - Children attending the Al Ibrahimiyeh primary school in the H2 area of Hebron city who approach it from the south continue to have to pass through metal detector gates set up by the IDF north of the Abu Rish Mosque.
 - The IDF and Israeli Police escorted Palestinian students from Tuba to their school in At Tuwani, south Hebron governorate. The escort has been provided since 2004 to protect the students from attacks carried by Israelis from the Ma'on settlement.

c) Access to Employment

The IDF announced on 13 November that general closure imposed on the oPt since 24 September was lifted. From 14 November external movement of was again observed in southern governorates of the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. Palestinian workers from the six northern governorates in the West Bank (Jenin, Tubas, Nablus, Qalqiliya, Tulkarm and Salfit) were allowed entry to Israel from 16 November.

d) Closures/Movement restrictions

Nablus Governorate:

16 November: The IDF closed Huwwara checkpoint for two hours in the afternoon after arresting one Palestinian in possession of an explosive belt.

16 November: The IDF reopened Beit Furik checkpoint for male residents of Beit Furik village age under 30 years old.

19 November: The IDF closed Huwwara checkpoint for two hours after arresting three Palestinian in possession of rifle bullets.

20 November: The IDF opened the entrance of Jamma'in which connects the village with Road No. 505.

21 November: Palestinians opened Beita - Aqraba road at the junction with Road No. 505 which had been closed since 12 November.

Ongoing incidents:

- Shave Shomeron checkpoint remains closed.
- All entrances connecting Sabastiya village with Road No. 60 remain blocked with earth mounds.
- Hamra checkpoint remains closed for all Palestinian non-residents of the Jordan Valley. Medical personal and teachers are allowed through.
- The dirt road connecting Tulkarm with Road No. 60 near Sabastiya (at the junction with Road No. 57) continues to be blocked with earth mounds.
- Except for the main entrance, all entrances from Beita to Road No. 60 remain closed with earth mounds.

Jenin Governorate:

16 November: The IDF restricted commercial trucks transporting goods to Barta'a enclave to 35 trucks a day carrying food products.

18 – 22 November: The IDF closed all agricultural Barrier gates and prevented farmers from reaching their land.

Ongoing incidents:

- All entrances to Ya'bad village remain closed by the IDF with road blocks and barbed wire. Only one alternative road towards Jenin city is open through Kufeir it village.
- Road No. 585 from Mevo Dotan settlement entrance to Kharmesh settlement entrance remains closed with two checkpoints.
- The metal gate at a road leading from Ya'bad town and the two checkpoints on Road No. 585 near Mevo Dotan and Kharmesh settlements entrances are hindering Palestinian movement in the area. Palestinians are using dirt roads to reach there charcoal factories and olive groves in the area.

Tubas Governorate:

16 November: The IDF closed Bisan checkpoint for Israeli and Palestinian commercial trucks transporting vegetables from Jordan Valley into Israel. The trucks had to go to Al Jalama crossing via Al Hamra checkpoint.

Ongoing incidents:

- Tayasir checkpoint remains closed for all Palestinian non-residents of the Jordan Valley. Medical personal and teachers are allowed through.

Tulkarm Governorate:

16 – 22 November: The IDF opened 'Anabta gate for vehicular movement and established a daily flying checkpoint at the junction to Tulkarm.

16 November: The IDF opened the checkpoint west of 'Anabta village at the junction to Bizzariya village.

Ongoing incidents:

- The IDF continues to prevent Palestinians with Israeli IDs from entering Palestinian controlled areas unless they have relatives living in Tulkarm.
- The IDF continues to close a road connecting Dihinnaba with Kafr Al Labad villages by earth mounds.
- The IDF continues to close the roads between Deir al Ghusun and Iktaba, Bal'a and Tulkarm by earth mounds.

Qalqiliya Governorate:

20– 22 November: The IDF at Jayyus Barrier gate prevented farmers to use their unlicensed tractors to reach their land in the closed areas.

Ongoing incidents:

- The IDF at Zfim Barrier gate prevented Palestinian farmers to use carriages to reach their lands in the closed areas.

Salfit Governorates:

18 November: The IDF closed the western entrance of Deir Istiya with an earth mound.

19 November: The IDF opened the main road (No. 446) between Rafat and Deir Ballut.

21 November: The IDF opened the closure of Qarawat Bani Hassaan on Road No. 505.

Ramallah / Al Bireh Governorate:

The Israeli authorities have issued permits for 14 Palestinian taxis to allow them to drive on Road No. 443 during certain restricted hours during the day (between Qalandiya and Makkabim checkpoints). These taxis are only permitted to take people going in/out of At Tira village.

The IDF is opening the gate at the entrance to At Tira village for two and a half hours every day to enable people to travel to Qalandiya via Road No. 443. The opening hours are between 7 - 8:00am; 2 - 2:30pm and 6 - 7:00pm. However, the opening hours are not uniform and depend on the IDF soldiers at the gate.

Ongoing incidents:

- Temporary vehicular and pedestrian arrangements are now in place at Qalandiya checkpoint while construction of the new checkpoint continues. The main road through the old checkpoint is now closed. Traffic is being rerouted to a new road to the east that joins the main road between Qalandiya and Jaba'. A temporary fenced walkway is in place for pedestrians.

Hebron and Bethlehem Governorates:

Movement restrictions on private Palestinian vehicles on Road No. 60 continued to be enforced throughout the reporting period; only taxis and buses were allowed to move

between Zif junction (Road No. 317) and Al Khadr (Road No. 60), with entrance into Bethlehem possible through the Beit Jala DCO checkpoint.

Hebron

Ongoing incidents:

- The IDF continues to close Zif gate from Road No. 317.
- The IDF continues to close Yatta gate with earth mounds from Road No. 60.
- No access is possible along the original road to the village of Imneizil as construction for the Barrier in the area is being completed. Local Palestinian residents are increasingly discouraged from moving in a vehicle to and from the village along the path of the Barrier by the security guards hired to protect the contractors. Palestinians from Imneizil often resort to walking on foot to reach the nearest urban area as movement is also restricted by the presence of an IDF checkpoint (Beit Yatir) and along Road No. 317.
- The IDF continues to patrol the area of H1 area of Hebron city and to perform random checks on Palestinians in violation of the Hebron Protocol.

Bethlehem

Ongoing incidents:

- The road from Al Jab'a to Surif remains closed with road blocks.
- The new checkpoint at Gilo is reported to be creating delays of up to 30 minutes for people crossing out of Bethlehem and into Jerusalem by foot.

Jerusalem Governorate:

Ongoing incidents:

- The IDF closed the road from Qalandiya checkpoint towards Atarot checkpoint; construction of the Barrier is taking place for the part of the Barrier near Qalandiya and Al Ram area for the new arrangements at the Qalandiya checkpoint.

Jericho Governorate:

No incidents to report.

6. The Olive Harvest:

- **16 and 18 November:** Israeli settlers from Itamar physically assaulted a Palestinian farmer from 'Awarta and tried to prevent other farmers to pick their olives on land near the settlement (Nablus). The IDF later forced the settlers to leave.

7. Additional Protection Issues:

- **19 November:** Israeli settlers from the settlement of Kiryat Arba stoned and harassed Palestinian families living in the area of Wadi Al Husain (H2 area Hebron city).

Appendix: Checkpoints 16 – 22 November 2005

Checkpoint	Status
Tulkarm:	
Taybeh	Open from 5.30am to 5pm for UN and international organisations and Palestinians with permits. Since 16 November Palestinian workers and traders with valid permits were again allowed access to Israel.
Efrayim	The checkpoint is constructed as a crossing point into Israel for Palestinian workers and traders and others from Tulkarm Governorate with a special permit. On 29 June the checkpoint became operational from 4am – 7pm and Palestinian workers and traders are instructed to cross through. Since 16 November Palestinian workers and traders with valid permits were again allowed access to Israel.
Kafriat	The checkpoint is manned and physically divided into three parts: one that controls movement to and from Tulkarm town; one that controls movement to Israel proper; and one that controls movement to and from Jubara. On 24 August the Tunnel near the checkpoint under Road No. 57 was opened reducing the need to use the checkpoint.
'Anabta	This gate was reestablished on 14 July 2005. Since 16 November opened for Palestinian vehicles to cross in and out of Tulkarm.
Qalqiliya:	
Qalqiliya DCO	Unmanned.
Jaljoulia	Access through this checkpoint is only granted for holders of permits into Israel and residents of Ras Tira, Ad Dab'a, Wadi Ar Rasha, Ramadin and Arab Abu Farda. Ambulances from Qalqiliya town to these five villages need prior coordination with DCL. Only vehicles leaving the West Bank are subjects for security checks. Since 16 November Palestinian workers and traders with valid permits were again allowed access to Israel.
Salfit:	
Deir Ballut	Officially open between 6am and 6pm. The checkpoint controls movement between Ramallah and the villages in the western part of Salfit District.
Kafr Qasem (Road No. 5)	Open 24 hours for UN and international organisations and Palestinians with permits. Since 16 November Palestinian workers and traders with valid permits were again allowed access to Israel.
Nablus:	
Huwwara Southern main entrance	Open for humanitarian organisations and Palestinians. Israeli citizens, Palestinian holders of Jerusalem IDs and holders of international passports are subject to prior liaison with the IDF before access can be granted. Movement is allowed from 4:30 am to 8 pm.
Beit Iba Western entrance, mainly for trade	Open for humanitarian organisations and Palestinians. Israeli citizens, Palestinian holders of Jerusalem IDs and holders of international passports are subject to prior liaison with IDF before access can be granted. Open between 6 am and 8 pm.
Sarra South western entrance, before the closure regime main road to Qalqiliya	Closed except to villagers from Sarra or Qusin, who occasionally given access.
Qusin Internal closure Between Sarra and Nablus	Closed by a gate and an earth mound since mid-March 2004; traffic diverted through Beit Iba checkpoint.
Al Tur Southern checkpoint connecting the Samaritan district of Jarzim with Nablus City	Only open for Samaritans. The gate is occasionally open for vehicles.
Beit Furik Eastern gate and checkpoint. After the closure regime main gateway between Nablus and the Jordan Valley	Open for villagers from Beit Furik, Beit Dajan, and open between 6am and 6pm.
Shave Shomeron (Sabastia) Northwest, main road to Jenin	Since 15 August the checkpoint is closed for Palestinians. Only humanitarian vehicles are allowed through.

Method and Sources

The information used to compile these Briefing Notes comes from a range of sources with a field presence in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. The accuracy of the reported information is ensured through the corroboration of reports by two additional sources. Typically, the OCHA Field Coordination Unit (FCU) receives an initial incident report from a source, which is verified through visits to the incident site in addition to further corroboration with a third source, such as an NGO. In addition, OCHA FCU collects military orders as documentary evidence and provides information on incidents witnessed in person.

In the interests of timeliness and readability, the sources are not listed for each incident within the texts of the report. Listed below are the sources relied upon each week in compiling this Briefing:
