


WEST BANK ACCESS RESTRICTIONS – JULY 2025



WEST BANK BARRIER

The Barrier consists of concrete walls, fences, ditches, razor wire, sand paths, an electronic monitoring system, patrol roads, a buffer zone and several military checkpoints. Eighty-five per cent of the Barrier's route runs inside the West Bank, separating Palestinian communities from farmland isolated by the Barrier and from other Palestinian communities who live between the Green Line and the Barrier and where access is largely regulated by a permit regime. In its Advisory Opinion on 8 July 2024, the International Court of Justice found that the construction of the wall being built by Israel in the occupied Palestinian territory, including in and around East Jerusalem, and its associated regime, are contrary to international law.



THE PERMIT REQUIREMENT



- Intended Nature Reserve: Full Israeli control over security, planning and construction



EAST JERUSALEM

At the end of 2023, East Jerusalem was projected to be home to about 390,000 Palestinians (Jerusalem Institute for Policy and Research 2022) and over 230,000 Israeli settlers (ICBS 2020), while about five million Palestinians from the remaining Occupied Palestinian Territory (OPT) are barred from residing in East Jerusalem. Even if they meet the age and other requirements, they can only enter the city with Israeli-issued permits, which are not easy to obtain and, for some, impossible. Only three of the 13 checkpoints along the Barrier are available to those who manage to secure permits.
