WEST BANK DEMOLITIONS AND DISPLACEMENT: AN OVERVIEW

ASSISTANCE DEMOLISHED/ SEIZED IN 2020



OVERVIEW

In February, the Israeli authorities demolished or seized 44 Palestinian-owned structures in Area C, East Jerusalem and Area A. The demolitions left 79 people displaced, including 34 children and otherwise affected the livelihoods or access to services of over 200 others. All structures, except for one in Jenin demolished on punitive grounds, were targeted due to a lack of building permits, which are nearly impossible for Palestinians to obtain.

Ten (10) of the structures targeted this month had been previously provided as humanitarian assistance, including eight (8) funded by the EU and its member states, for nearly 30,000 euros. An additional 14 EU-funded structures, at a value of nearly 29,000 euros, were served with demolition or stop-work orders.

Nineteen of the structures demolished or seized this month were in Area C, well below the monthly average in 2019 (33 structures), with the majority of them (13) located in the Hebron governorate.

The use of Military Order 1797, which allows for the expedited removal of unlicensed structures deemed as "new", continued, with 11 structures (residential, agricultural and animal structures) demolished or seized on these grounds in February. This represents the second largest application of this order in a single month, after November 2019 (12), since the start of its implementation in July 2019. The average period between the delivery of a 'removal notice' under this order and its execution was eight days in January and February 2020, compared to 22 days in 2019.

Four of the donor-funded structures targeted this month were located in herding communities located in areas declared a closed 'firing zone' for military training, in southern Hebron (Massafer Yatta area) and in eastern Nablus (Khirbet Tana). Another donor-funded structure, a caravan used as a storage room at a school, was also demolished in Susiya, a herding community in the Hebron governorate. These communities are at heightened risk of forcible transfer due to the coercive environment they face.

In East Jerusalem, 24 structures were demolished this month, half of them by their owners following the issuance of demolition orders. Jabal al Mukabbir continues to be the most affected locality in the city, with eight (8) demolitions, including two (2) EU-funded structures.

After holding a series of meetings with local leaders in the East Jerusalem neighborhood of Al Issawiyah, Jerusalem Mayor Moshe Leon announced a freeze on the demolition of homes in the neighborhood for six months in order to advance a new planning scheme. Since mid-2019, life in Al Issawiya has been severely disrupted due to continuous Police operations, as well as the demolition of 11 structures.


On 6 February, the Israeli authorities punitively demolished a home in Jenin, which had previously been demolished on 23 April 2018. This is the family home of a Palestinian serving a prison sentence for participating in the killing of an Israeli settler in Salfit in January 2018. Clashes erupted during the demolition, in which Israeli forces shot and killed two Palestinians, including a 19-year-old youth and a Palestinian policeman, who was reportedly present inside the police station at the time of the clashes. Another nine Palestinians were injured.


