

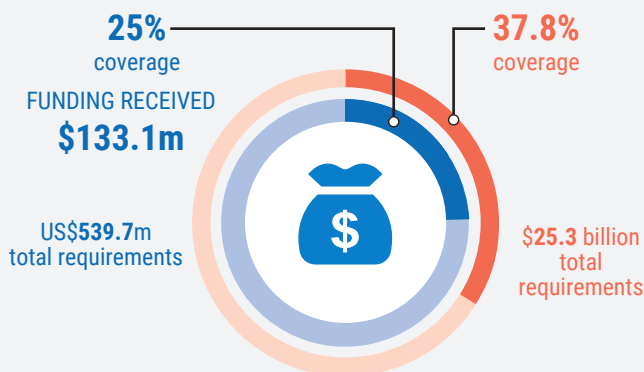
OVERVIEW

Financing of humanitarian action is at an all-time low for the oPt. The 2018 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) requirements are only 25 per cent funded to date. Without adequate funding, humanitarian partners will struggle to respond to the needs of people affected by crisis across the oPt.

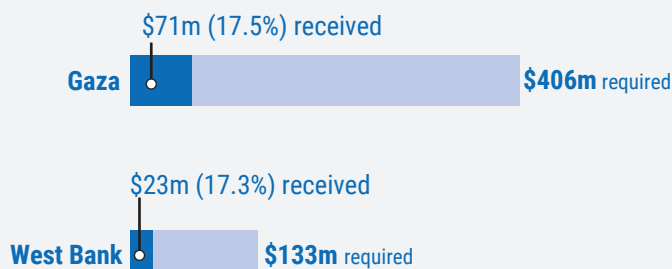
OPT 2018 HRP FUNDING

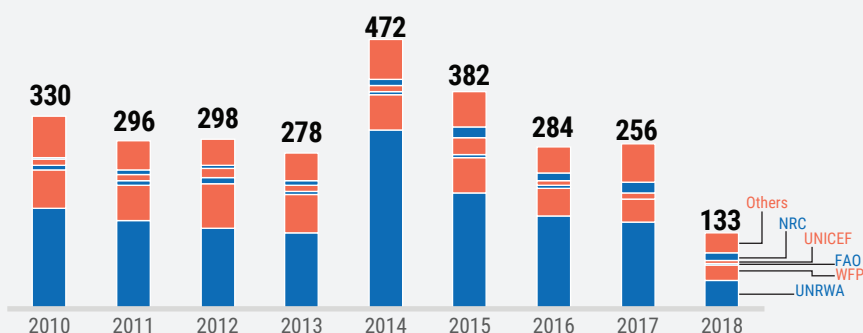

Humanitarian funding in 2018 is significantly lower compared with the same period over the past eight years. The decline this year in funding for UNRWA, the single largest humanitarian actor in the oPt, has been a key contributing factor. However, nearly all agencies in the HRP have received less funding in 2018, as compared with previous years at this date, negatively affecting the majority of the humanitarian operations in the oPt.
