

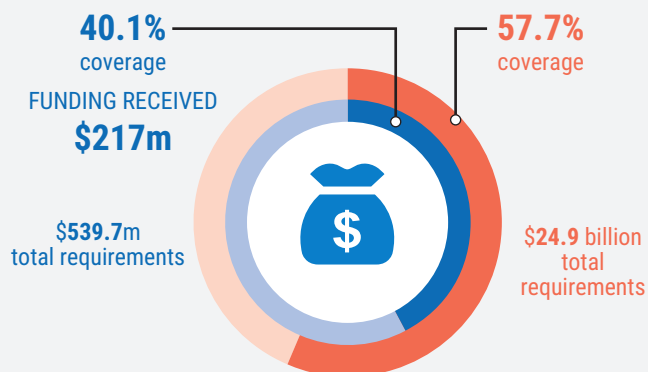
OVERVIEW

Financing of humanitarian action is at an all-time low for the oPt. The 2018 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) has received just US\$217 million, the lowest ever despite increasing needs. Without adequate funding, humanitarian partners are struggling to respond to the needs of people affected by crisis across the oPt.

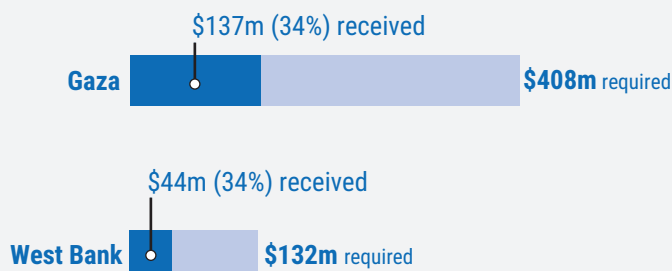
OPT 2018 HRP FUNDING

*This does not include some \$36 million funding received for the HRP that has yet to be allocated by location.

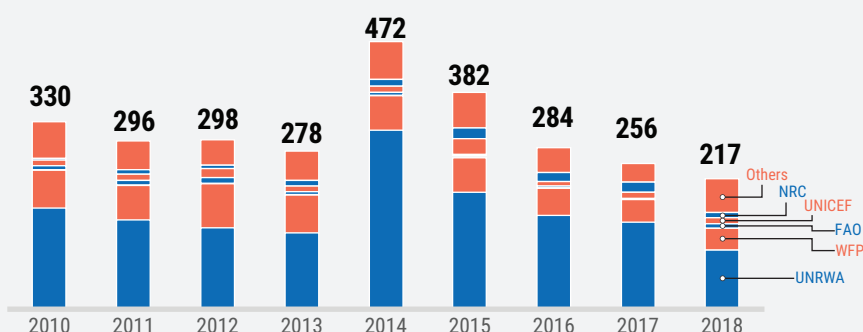

Humanitarian funding in 2018 is significantly lower as compared to the same period over the last eight years. The decline this year in funding for UNRWA, the single largest humanitarian actor in the oPt, has been a key contributing factor. However, nearly all agencies in the HRP have received less funding in 2018, as compared to previous years at this date, negatively affecting the majority of the humanitarian operation in the oPt.
