
## OPT: HUMANITARIAN FUNDING UPDATE as of 31 May 2018

## **OVERVIEW**

Financing of humanitarian response is at an all-time low for the occupied Palestinian territory (oPt). The 2018 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) requirements are only 17.5 per cent funded to date. Without adequate funding, humanitarian partners will struggle to respond to the needs of people affected by crisis across the oPt.




Outside the HRP, an additional \$29m has been recorded as humanitarian funding for the oPt.

Humanitarian funding in 2018 is significantly lower compared with the same period over the past eight years. The decline this year in funding for UNRWA, the single largest humanitarian actor in the oPt, has been a key contributing factor. However, nearly all agencies in the HRP have received less funding in 2018, as compared with previous years at this date, negatively affecting the most humanitarian operations in the oPt.





## **OPT HUMANITARIAN FUND**

In 2018 to date \$7.44 million has been received in funding for the oPt Humanitarian Fund (HF). Additional pledges are in the pipeline.
