

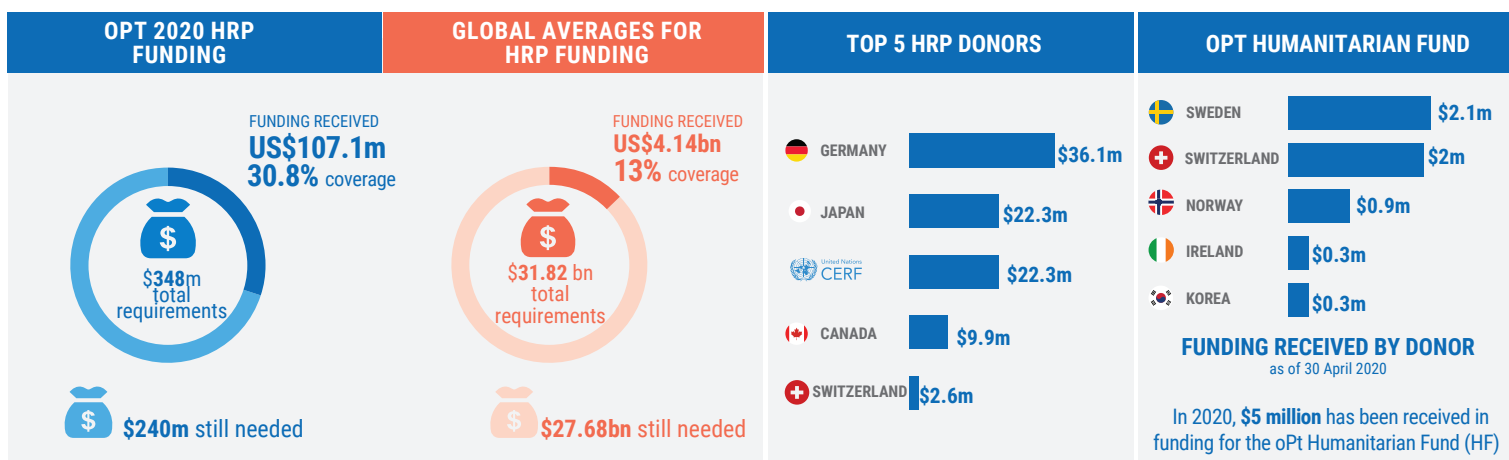
OPT: HUMANITARIAN FUNDING UPDATE (as of 30 April 2020)



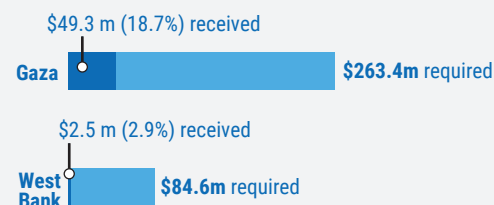
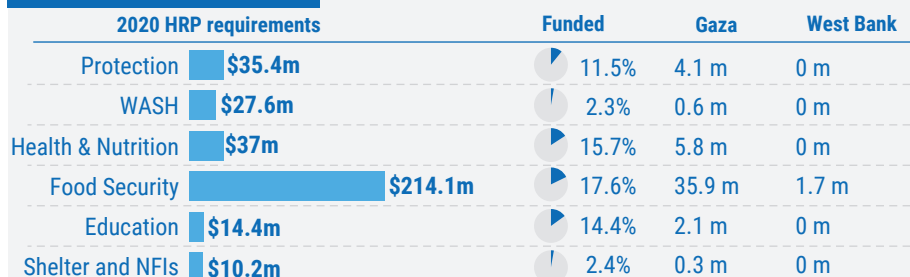
OVERVIEW

The 2020 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) requirements are 31 per cent funded. This amount has doubled since the past month thanks to the funding provided by Canada and Japan to UNICEF, UNFPA and some INGO's.

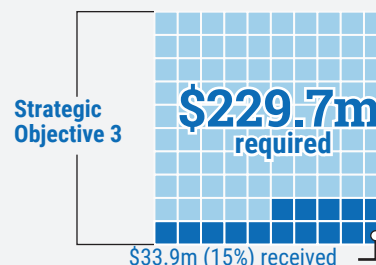
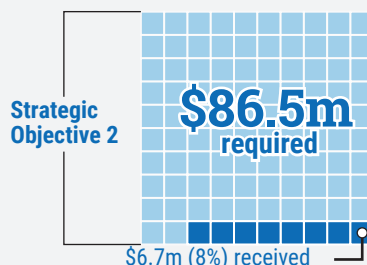
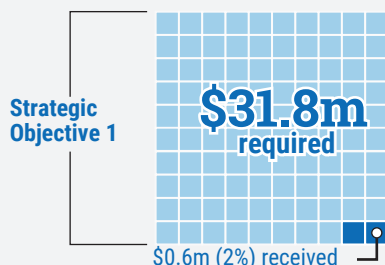


BY CLUSTER AND LOCATION*



* This does not include some \$16.9 Million funding received for the HRP that did not specify a cluster

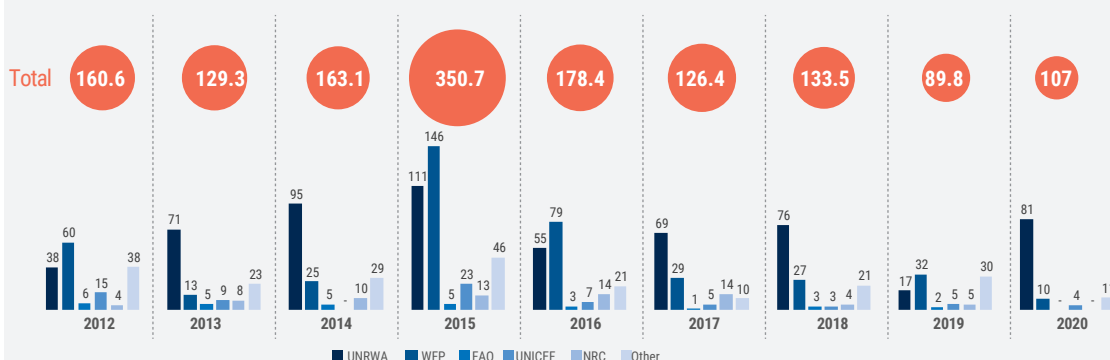
BY STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE*

As of the end of April, humanitarian funding is 20% higher compared to the same period in 2019. This month UN agencies have received more support than during first three months of the year. UNRWA has received the largest share of HRP funding. UNICEF and UNFPA have received their first funding since the beginning of the year towards their projects in oPt. Initial recording of support to NGO's projects such as MA'AN Development Center, Action Contre la Faim and Palestinian Medical Relief Society among others has started.
