
OPT: HUMANITARIAN FUNDING UPDATE (as of 31 January 2020)



OVERVIEW

The 2020 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) requirements are only 1.3 per cent funded to date. Early support to the Humanitarian Response Plan will be crucial to provide humanitarian assistance to people affected by crisis across the oPt.

Early funding in support to the oPt HRP 2020 appears to be significantly lower than the last eight years. This month the steep decline in funding for UNRWA, the single largest humanitarian actor in the oPt, has become a key contributing factor of this trend. WFP has also faced a significant funding shortfall in comparison to the same period in 2019. UNICEF and FAO, two other UN agencies with wide representation of projects in 2020 HRP, have not received any funding to date. Among NGO's, only Save the Children recorded some limited funding towards its projects. Nearly all organizations involved in the HRP have received so far less funding in 2020, compared to previous years.
