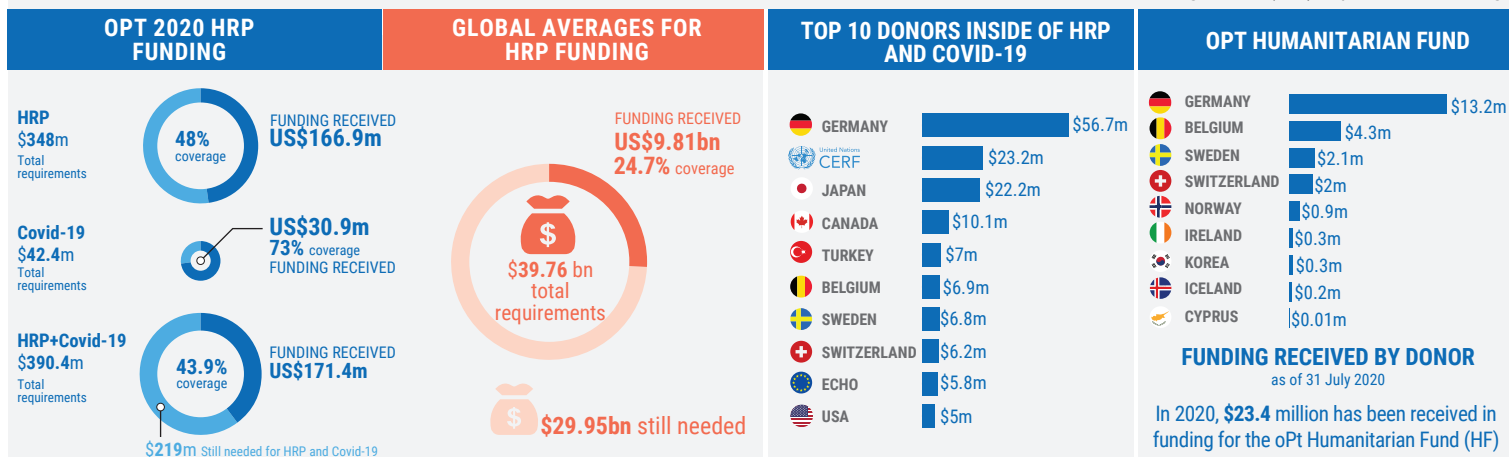


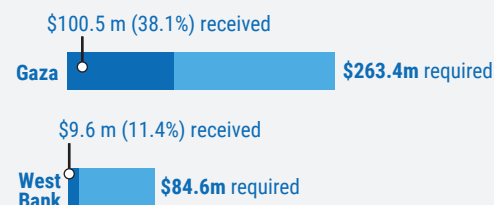
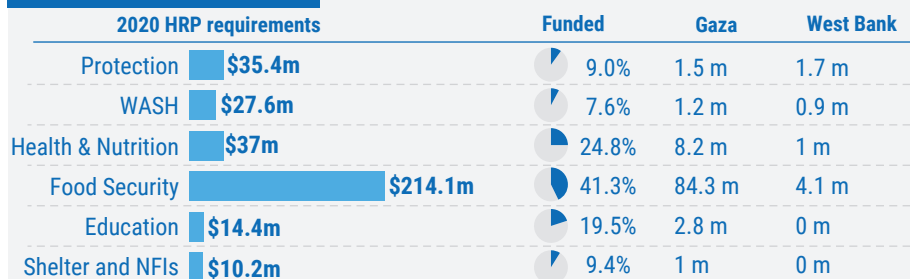
OVERVIEW

The 2020 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) requirements are 48 per cent funded, that shows slight increase since the past month thanks to generous funding provided by Germany in addition to support from Spain and Nour Sims. During past month humanitarian response and donors activity were redirected towards Covid-19 response, therefore, some activities within HRP targeted to meet the needs of vulnerable Palestinians may have to be reduced. Further continuous support from donors is necessary to implement the essential projects of 2020 HRP.

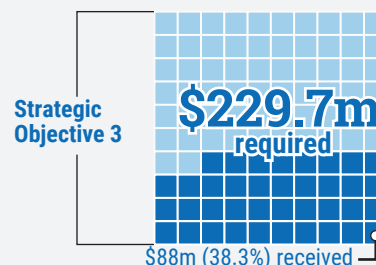
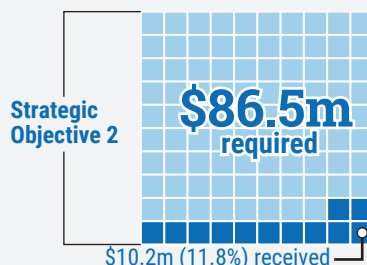
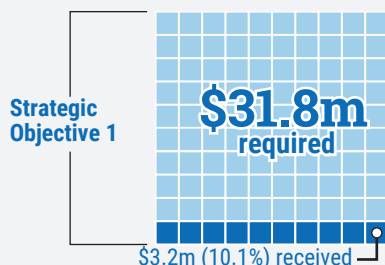


BY CLUSTER AND LOCATION*



* This does not include some \$56.9m funding received for the HRP that did not specify a cluster and some \$15.7m allocated for Covid-19 related activities

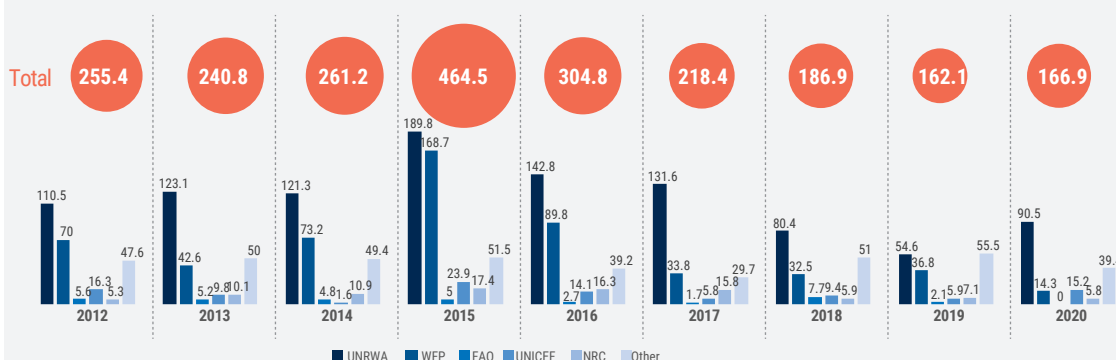
BY STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE*

As of the end of May, humanitarian funding is only 3% higher compared to the same period in 2019. However, not all UN agencies have received more support than during the same period in the past year. UNRWA has received the largest share of HRP funding. UNICEF has received new contributions during past month, and its overall funding is significantly higher than during the same period last year. WFP remains significantly underfunded and received 60% less funding than at this point last year. Germany currently appears to be the largest donor both to HRP including oPt Humanitarian Fund and to Covid-19 related activities.
