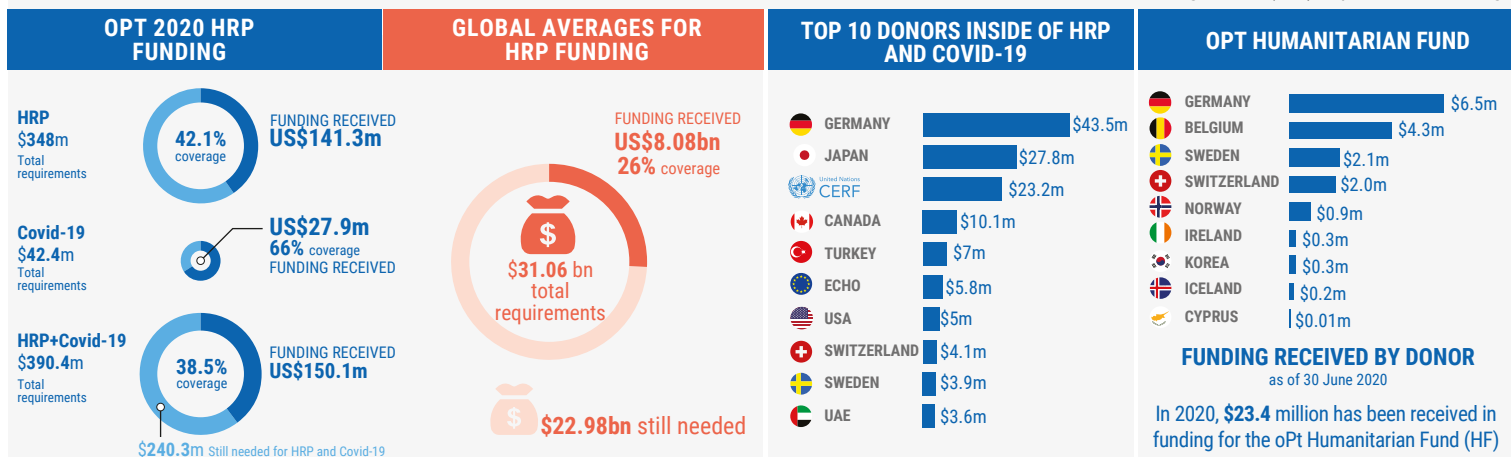


OVERVIEW

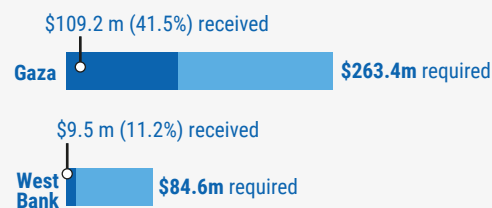
The 2020 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) requirements are 41 per cent funded, that shows 10 per cent increase since the past month thanks to funding provided by Germany to WFP, ECHO's contribution to NRC and Sweden funding towards Islamic Relief Society in addition to funding received by UNICEF from Poland in addition to generous support provided by donors to Humanitarian Fund.

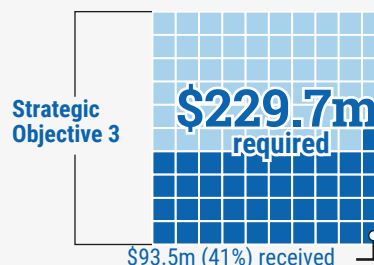
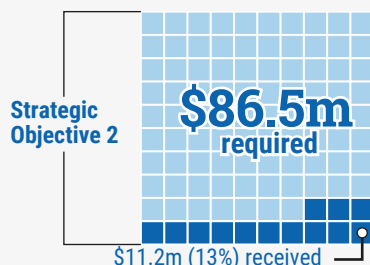
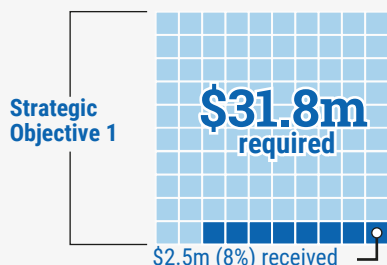

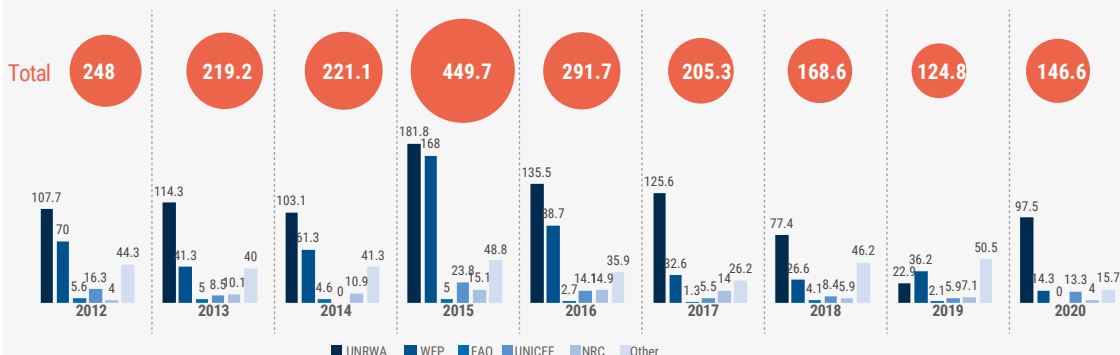

As of the end of May, humanitarian funding is 18% higher compared to the same period in 2019. However, not all UN agencies have received more support than during the same period in the past year. UNRWA has received the largest share of HRP funding. UNICEF has received new contributions during past month, although its overall funding is still less than during the same period last year. WFP remains significantly underfunded and received 60% less funding than at this point last year. Germany currently appears to be the largest donor both to HRP including oPt Humanitarian Fund and to Covid-19 related activities.
