Two years after the end of the most devastating round of hostilities in the Gaza Strip since 1967, significant progress has been made in the reconstruction. However, addressing outstanding needs will require greater uninterrupted flow of material, new funding, as well as renewed emphasis on sectors that are vital to economic recovery.

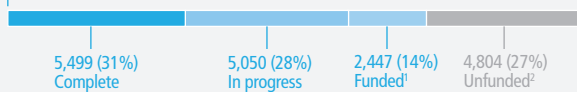

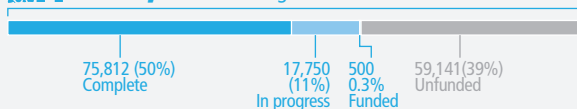

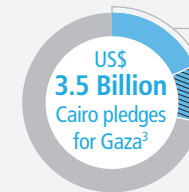

Cairo Pledges disbursed for Gaza Detailed Needs Assessment priority areas

Uninterrupted and predictable flow of material

Nine years into the blockade of the Gaza Strip, Israel must ensure an uninterrupted and predictable flow of essential construction material into Gaza to ensure timely implementation, address outstanding needs and help reverse Gaza's de-development trajectory.

Planning and coordination

The Government of Palestine must increase investment in the National Office for the Reconstruction of Gaza (NORG) and all stakeholders must come together to ensure coordinated and coherent planning for sustainable recovery from the neighbourhood up to the national level.
