


Between 1993 and 2000, Israel and the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO) signed a number of agreements that called for the transfer of power from the Israeli military and its civil administration to the Palestinian Authority (PA), which was created in this context. The main agreements signed included:

- **A Declaration of Principles (1993)**, which established the framework of the negotiations;
- **The Agreement on the Gaza Strip and Jericho Area (1994)**, calling for the PA's deployment in those areas;
- **The Israeli-Palestinian Interim Agreement on the West Bank and Gaza Strip (1995)**, which divided the West Bank (with the exception of Hebron city and East Jerusalem) into three areas: A, B and C;
- **The Hebron Protocol (1997)**, which outlined the transfer of power in Hebron city, with delegation of powers to the PA in part of the city (H1) and ongoing Israeli military presence in the remainder (H2); and
- **The Wye River Memorandum (1998)**, which, among other issues, called for the transfer to PA administration of some three per cent of the West Bank as a designated "nature reserve".





INTRODUCTION

The context in the oPt is a protracted protection crisis with humanitarian consequences, driven by insufficient respect for international law by all sides. Palestinians in the oPt face a range of serious protection threats in the context of Israel's prolonged occupation and periodic escalation of armed conflict, including threats to life, liberty and security, destruction or damage to homes and other property, forced displacement, restrictions on freedom of movement and on access to livelihoods, and lack of accountability and effective remedy. These threats are exacerbated by the inability of the sides to reach a political agreement. The seasonal winter flooding further exacerbates pre-existing humanitarian needs. In 2014, there was a sharp increase in the severity of humanitarian needs in the Gaza Strip as a result of the July-August conflict.



The Barrier has reduced the access of Palestinians to workplaces and essential services. Agriculture-based livelihoods of thousands of families have been undermined, and access of service providers to communities behind the Barrier, including ambulances and fire brigades, has also been impaired. In its 2004 Advisory Opinion, the International Court of Justice established that the sections of the Barrier which run inside the West Bank, including East Jerusalem, together with the associated gate and permit regime, violate Israel's obligations under international law. © Photo by OCHA



West Bank, including East Jerusalem

In 2014, the West Bank witnessed the highest number of Palestinian fatalities in incidents involving Israeli forces since 2007 and the highest number of Palestinian injuries since 2005, when OCHA began collecting data. Violence peaked in the second part of the year, following the abduction and killing of three Israeli youths and the reported retaliatory killing of a Palestinian youth in East Jerusalem in July; in protests against the July-August hostilities in the Gaza Strip; and in confrontations during October and November regarding perceived changes to the status quo of the Al Aqsa Mosque compound. Also of concern is the sharp increase in the percentage of child casualties by Israeli forces; **13** were killed, compared to **four** in 2013, the highest number recorded in the West Bank since 2006. Palestinian attacks against Israeli civilians (mostly settlers) and security forces also rose in 2014, with Israeli fatalities increasing from **four** to **12**.




Palestinian Injuries by Governorate



Cause of Injuries

Of particular concern during 2014 was the sharp increase in the Israeli forces' use of live ammunition in the West Bank which, in addition to almost all the fatalities, accounted for **1,112**, or nearly **18%**, of Palestinian injuries, up from **4%** in 2013 and **2%** in 2012. Rubber-coated metal bullets accounted for **43%** of injuries, up from **39%** in 2013. Despite the frequency of clashes in East Jerusalem, there were no recorded Palestinian deaths or injuries from live ammunition or rubber-coated metal bullets in areas located on the 'Jerusalem side' of the Barrier. Responsibility for law enforcement in these areas lies with the Israeli civil police which, unlike the army and the Border Police, is not allowed to use these types of ammunition for crowd control purposes.

Violence by and against Settlers

In 2014, incidents of settler violence resulting in Palestinian casualties and the number of injured Palestinians increased, although the number of incidents leading to Palestinian property/ land damage decreased. The number of attacks by Palestinians leading to Israeli casualties significantly increased.



Palestinians in Detention

The monthly average (5,258) of Palestinians held by the Israeli authorities for alleged security offences increased by **24%** in 2014.³ Data on Palestinian children in military detention show that a monthly average of **185** children were in Israeli military custody in 2014, compared to **197** in 2013, a **6%** decrease. The monthly average of those held under administrative detention increased significantly to **327**, from **132** in 2013 and **245** in 2012. No children under the age of 14 were held in detention in 2014, a positive trend that started in late 2013.⁴

Detainees by Monthly Average







The 19 refugee camps throughout the West Bank were established as temporary tented cities for Palestine refugees¹ driven from their homes due to the 1948 conflict, and who remain in forced exile to this day. Today, these camps have developed into urban areas home to more than 200,000 people, with the population in each camp varying from 2,500 to 27,000. The camps are characterized by humanitarian needs related to overcrowding, high levels of unemployment and food insecurity, and ongoing violence related to ISF incursions in the camps.







Barrier

In East Jerusalem, the Barrier divides Palestinian neighbourhoods from each other and from the urban centre, resulting in diminished services, increasing lawlessness, impeded access and uncertain residency status.





UN position on East Jerusalem

Israel's annexation of East Jerusalem is not recognized by the international community. The UN Security Council has declared in numerous resolutions (inter alia, resolutions 252, 267, 471, 476 & 478) that all legislative measures and actions taken by Israel to alter the character and status of Jerusalem are null and void. The legal situation in the West Bank including East Jerusalem, remains one of belligerent military occupation.

VULNERABILITY PROFILE PROJECT (VPP) 2013

Among the key drivers of humanitarian vulnerability in Area C are policies and practices applied by the Israeli authorities in the context of the ongoing occupation of the West Bank. These include settlement activity; a discriminatory planning and zoning regime; and restrictions on Palestinian movement and access, including Barrier construction. These measures combine to impede Palestinian access to livelihoods, shelter and basic services and assistance, including health, education and water and sanitation services. In many cases, they contribute to the forced displacement of Palestinians.


Main Source of Livelihood for Area C Residents





Over 7,500 Palestinian Bedouins and herders in **46** communities in the central West Bank are at risk of forcible transfer due to a "relocation" plan by the Israeli authorities. The individuals targeted are predominantly refugees who oppose the transfer plan. In August 2014, the Israeli Civil Administration (ICA) deposited outline plans for the creation of a new town near Jericho to transfer some of these communities. In 2014, the ICA demolished, dismantled and seized approximately **70** residential and livelihood-related structures in at least **ten** of these communities.




East Jerusalem

In East Jerusalem, Palestinian residents are at risk of displacement as a result of home demolitions, inability to build, forced eviction and takeover of their property by settler organizations, and the lack of secure residency status.



Area C

Although there was a slight decline in the number of structures demolished in Area C in 2014, there was a 20% increase in the number of people displaced, due to an increase in residential structures demolished. Area C covers over 60% of the West Bank, where Israel retains exclusive control over planning and zoning and less than 1% has been planned for Palestinian development. According to information provided by the Israeli Civil Administration, during 2014 the Israeli authorities issued a total of 911 demolition orders against Palestinian structures in Area C on the grounds of the lack of building permits (an order may target more than one structure). Only 4% (36) were actually executed, while the rest of the demolitions were based on orders issued in previous years.




SEA AREAS ACCESSIBLE TO FISHERMEN




GAZA STRIP GOVERNORATE POPULATION AND AGE DISTRIBUTION¹

An area of **Beit Hanoun**, Gaza, which was heavily affected during the 2014 hostilities. Overall, across the Gaza Strip, 12,620 housing units were totally destroyed over the course of the 51-day-long escalation and 6,455 were severely damaged, displacing about 100,000 people. It was the largest displacement recorded in Gaza since 1967. As of mid-2015, displaced Palestinians in Gaza are accommodated with host families, in rented apartments, prefabricated units, tents and makeshift shelters, or in the rubble of their previous homes, and suffer from poor living conditions. © Photo by OCHA

Checkpoints

are composed of two elements - an infrastructure which impedes vehicular and pedestrian traffic and permanent presence of Israeli security personnel (e.g. the IDF, the Border Police, the civil Police, a private security company). Security personnel usually check the documentation of persons crossing the checkpoint and conduct searches on their vehicles and their belongings.



Partial Checkpoints
are made up of similar infrastructure as checkpoints but are not permanently staffed. Frequently, the partial checkpoint infrastructure is installed on roadsides and, therefore, does not directly obstruct the traffic. When staffed, partial checkpoints function as the full checkpoints described above. When unstaffed, the traffic may flow relatively freely along the route.



Road Barriers
may be composed of a fence or a concrete barrier running along the side of a road. To be classified as a road barrier, this type of infrastructure should be at least 100 metres long and obstruct free passage of people, vehicles or livestock, onto, off or across the road.




Road Gates
Are metal gates used to block access to a route. All road gates (including those which were open when recorded by OCHA) are marked on the maps as closures, until the infrastructure is removed.



Earthwalls
Are Road Barriers, as defined above, composed of a series of earthmounds.



Earthmounds
Are mounds of rubble, dirt and/or rocks put in place by IDF bulldozers to prevent vehicular movement along a road or track. Several mounds less than 50 meters apart, blocking the same route, are only counted as one closure. If a mound is pushed to the side (by IDF or Palestinians) or if a route around it is created and vehicle access is possible, the mound is not recorded as an obstacle. Earth mounds are often removed or circumvented and then re-built and/or enlarged. Therefore, some of them appear on one map, disappear from the next and then subsequently reappear.



Trenches (or ditches)
are dug across flat land or along the side of a road to prevent vehicles from going around a closure obstacle on the road.



Roadblocks
Are constructed from one or more concrete blocks of about one cubic meter and, like earthmounds, are used to prevent vehicle access to land or roads. In all other respects, they are the same as earthmounds.
