
During May 2023, the occupied Palestinian territory Humanitarian Fund (oPt HF) had a total of 80 ongoing projects, for a total of US\$ 30 million, addressing urgent needs in the Gaza Strip (56 per cent) and West Bank (44 per cent). Projects focus on the areas of Education, Food Security, Health, Protection, Emergency Shelter & NFI, WASH, Coordination and Support Services, and Multi-Purpose Cash Assistance. Of these, 48 projects are being implemented by international NGOs, 28 projects by national NGOs and four projects by UN agencies. Of the 52 projects implemented by INGOs or the UN, 39 are being implemented in partnership with NNGOs.


